BC All-Star Games versus Visiting Professional Teams

Introduction

Before professional soccer became fully established in BC in 1974, visits of touring international professional teams to play exhibition games against local amateur or semi-pro all-star teams were a highlight of the annual soccer calendar in BC. These games created the excitement we now see with national team games, and considerable pride in the achievements of BC's players.

Beginning in 1911, 125 of these All-Star games have been played. Of these, 109 games were against professional teams, the remainder high-level amateur players. Before World War Two, the majority of games were touring representative teams of professional players from British FAs (associations). Later visits were touring professional clubs from the UK, continental Europe and globally.

This report covers the history of these BC All-Star games, an important part of the story of soccer in British Columbia. It has been completed to celebrate the All-Stars teams' achievements and to honour the players selected as the best in BC or their region, which at the time was the highest recognition players could achieve.

The report includes 13 pages of commentary plus a detailed listing of every All-Star game, including venue, BC team list, results, scorers and officials.

Note 1: There have also been All-Star games against North American teams, including California in the earliest days, and versus Canada teams, to be covered in a later report.

The Early Days: 1911 to 1939

The first overseas visitors to play All-Star teams were the English amateur club the Corinthians in 1911. The Corinthians, a prominent club of varsity players and graduates, regularly formed teams for overseas trips to promote soccer. In 1905 they visited Eastern Canada, then made it to the West Coast in August 1911.

In the first All-Star game, the Vancouver All-Stars lost 5-1, with James Teed scoring the very first All-Star goal. Two days later a picked Ladysmith-Nanaimo combined team tied Corinthians 2-2. The two games in Vancouver each attracted 4,000 spectators, the highest soccer game crowd to that point.

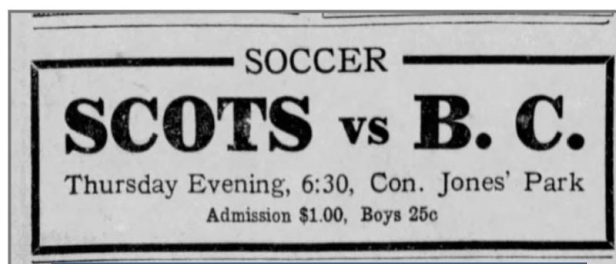


1911 Corinthians. First Overseas Visitors

Then followed a ten-year gap which included World War One and in-fighting in soccer in BC. In 1920 two groups applied to Canada Soccer to be recognized as BC's governing body. The winning group was led by promoter Con Jones. They promised they would bring Newcastle United to visit and give Canada Soccer 15 percent of the proceeds. After they were selected as BC's governing body, the Newcastle visit never materialized!

Note 2: Given that All-Star games were largely played before women's soccer was established, all but two games were between men's teams. Two BC All-Star women's teams played overseas touring teams in the 1980s.

In the following year, 1921, the first professional players toured Canada, a Scottish FA team under the Third Lanark club banner. "The Scots" played four games in BC, including the first game played at Con Jones (Callister) Park.

Corinthians returned in 1924, followed by eight professional team tours between 1926 and 1939. Most of these were selected British national association teams on Canadian tours arranged by Canada Soccer. Touring clubs included Glasgow Rangers making the first of its four tours to BC in 1930 and Charlton Athletic playing in 1937.

Visiting teams in these early years were warmly welcomed in each community. They were met by civic dignitaries at the station, banquets were arranged in their honour and sightseeing tours laid on. Tourists typically played four games, two in Vancouver and two on Vancouver Island. The local All-Star teams were variously the BC All-Stars, Island/Victoria/Upper Island All-Stars or Vancouver/Mainland selected area teams, or strong local teams, maybe strengthened with player pick-ups.

Competition was tough – the BC teams lost all 30 games against visiting professionals before 1939. Local teams did beat amateur visitors, the first being Upper Island defeating the 1924 Corinthians 2-1, but the best BC results against the pros were five one goal losses.

More important than the result was the visitors' role in promoting soccer, generating substantial newspaper coverage and interest, and attracting large crowds to the matches. Newspapers usually reported the local teams as playing valiantly, with the visitors' skill being a pleasure for up to 7,500 spectators to witness.

Visiting teams were of varying strengths of players. Popular in newspaper coverage was discussion of how each visiting team compared. On the basis of scores, candidates for the best visiting team before World War Two would include the 1926 English FA (combined score: 22-3 in 4 games), the 1927 Scottish FA (24-3 in 4 games), the 1930 Glasgow Rangers (15-2 in 2 games) and the 1931 English FA (26-4 in 4 games). Later, in 1954, Glasgow Rangers scored 19 goals without reply in three games.

The Scottish FA tour of 1939 was the last team to visit and play BC's All-Stars for ten years, as World War Two and post-war rebuilding took place. Many leading BC players spent 1939-1945 serving in the Canadian forces, some appearing for Canadian Army soccer teams.

The Heydays and Glory Days: 1949 – 1973

Four years after the end of World War Two, the international visitors resumed their trips to British Columbia. The next 25 years marked the All-Stars' heydays and glory days.

The first post-war visitors were Newcastle United in 1949, a visit notable for their manager's criticism of the grass-less Callister Park as a "disgrace to football". The pitch did not seem to faze his players, as they put 13 goals past BC All-Stars in two games.

This visit opened the gates to regular touring visitors. From 1949 to 1973, at least one touring team played in BC each year, and in many years, two teams visited. In these 25 years, the All-Stars played 62 games versus touring teams. Visitor came from the UK, Europe, Asia and Central and South America, usually visiting Vancouver and the Island as part of a Canadian or North American tour.

These tours frequency shows how popular they were with BC soccer fans and with visiting teams.

For the visitors, while a chance to promote the game and the club's brand and fan base, a summer tour provided extra income to players, and a chance to travel. The teams appreciated the hospitality. Andy Beattie, the 1955 Huddersfield Town manager wrote to BC Soccer saying: "... we shall carry away happy memories... able to enjoy every minute of our stay... it has been simply wonderful... with our warmest greetings and good wishes".

Player income was an important factor. European player wages in Europe were modest until the 1960s. In England, pro soccer players wages were "capped", the maximum weekly wage in 1957 was 17 pounds, worth \$46 Canadian. Win bonuses, 'money in the boots' or promotional income helped, but off-season wages were lower still.

This also explains why many local BC players, very much the equal of professionals, chose to play at home rather than overseas for these limited pro club wages. In 1957, the average manufacturing wage in BC was \$77 per week, more than they could make as a pro player in Europe. And these semi-pro players got win bonuses from Coast League teams.

It is totally different now, of course. Players for Wolverhampton, currently the bottom team in the English Premier League, receive annual wages averaging C\$3.5 million each, and players in the English third tier average C\$500,000 a year.

To fans and players, the All-Star games were important because it was the highest level of play available. At this time, there was no Canadian national team program. In the 28 years from 1928 to 1955, Canada played just two international matches. The very first Canada international match to be played in BC was in 1971, an Olympic qualifying game. The first World Cup qualifying game to be played in BC was in 1976.

So, for BC soccer fans, the All-Star games were the only chance to see top-level international players, and to see how BC's own players matched up.

The frequency of the All-Star games in the 50s and 60s makes this era's players the leaders in All-Star appearances, with Doug Greig and Ken Pears each racking-up 20 games. (See page 9).

After thirty games without a victory over visiting pro teams up to 1939, BC teams now started to win games. BC's landmark first victory against professional visitors came in 1951, the Victoria All-Stars beating Fulham 1-0 (see p. 11). Between 1951 and 1971, BC All-Star teams would win ten matches against pro visitors, with the "upset of the century" being in 1957 when the pride of BC beat Tottenham Hotspur 2-0, when 'Spurs had just finished second in England's top league (see p. 12).

For the most part, from the 1950s, national association teams had been replaced by pro clubs. Many were from England and Scotland, Tottenham visiting three times between 1952 and 1966.

From South America came Municipal FC of Peru and Santos and Cruzeiro from Brazil. The visit of Santos in 1972 was particularly special, as this brought Pele, recognized as the world's best player, to play at Empire Stadium. 16,300 BC fans got to see Pele and 15 players from the BC Premier League got to play against "the King". Santos won 5-0. Second-half BC keeper Greg Weber said: "It was harrowing... I can't recall when I've faced so many shots... hooks, drops, curves... they were picking the corners".

Another landmark visit was in 1956, when Moscow Lokomotiv played at the new Empire Stadium, the first time any Soviet Union sports team had played in Canada. Later visitors from Eastern Europe included Leningrad Zenit, Red Star Belgrade, Dinamo Zagreb and Moscow Dynamo. All these soccer encounters with Eastern Bloc teams were before the storied USSR-Canada hockey series in 1972.

The opening of Empire Stadium for the 1954 Commonwealth Games led to All-Star games in Vancouver moving across Renfrew, from Callister Park on the west side of the street to Empire stadium on the east.

The Upper Island dropped out of All-Star games after 1939, but Royal Athletic Park in Victoria continued to host regular games against the touring teams.

The increased number and frequency of touring teams led to another phenomenon: games in Vancouver between two touring teams. The first of these, Everton playing Aberdeen in 1956, was followed by twenty later similar match-ups of two guest pro clubs. (See Appendix 2). In most cases, one of the teams was in BC to play All-Star games, with an opposing team joining them from their North American tour for another game.

The Later Days: 1975 to date

One day in particular marks the end of the days when the best of BC's amateur and semi-pro players lined up against visiting professional teams.

That day was May 5, 1974, when the newly-formed Vancouver Whitecaps played their first game in the North American Soccer League, and professional soccer finally took root in British Columbia. From then on, touring teams mostly played the professional clubs instead of local All-Star teams.

Six years earlier in 1968, the first Vancouver pro club, the Royals, played three games against touring teams. In the nine years from 1976 to 1984, the NASL Whitecaps played 21 exhibition games against mostly European clubs, including Manchester United, AS Roma and Ajax. The 86ers and later Whitecaps added six more games between 1992 and 2011. (See Appendix 3)

The success of the NASL also created professional career opportunities for the strongest BC players, many of whom left BC from the mid-1970s to play for teams across North America. After the NASL, the Canadian Soccer League provided professional opportunities from 1987 to 1992. These and other pro leagues drew many top players from BC's community clubs, so they would not have been available for All-Star games. Unrestricted player income in Europe from the 1960s on led to steadily increasing salaries and very remunerative rewards for top BC players playing in that arena.

There were still occasional local All-Star games after 1975, especially on Vancouver Island. In the year between the NASL and the 86ers, the North Shore Colts hosted a tournament in BC Place, and in 2004 and 2005, BC Soccer invited UK clubs to the "Pacific International Series". There were also two women's All-Star games, the Greater Vancouver Women's Selects played Northern Island visitors in 1982 and the BC Women's All-Stars played Italy's AFC Milan in 1987.

Despite the occasional such game, the era of BC All-Stars was clearly over. Since 2014 there have been no All-Star games and, as far as we are aware, no exhibition pro club games versus overseas visitors. Club international soccer now includes CONCACAF tournaments featuring the Whitecaps and BC's other pro clubs.

The excitement provided to our soccer community by the All-Star games from the 1920s to the 1970s is now provided by Canadian national soccer team games, the 2015 Women's World Cup and the 2026 World Cup.

Now we cheer on Canada's men's and women's national teams playing the world's best in BC Place in the same way that our grandparents rooted for the BC All-Stars at Callister Park. The venues and the opponents are different, but we feel the very same pride as we "Take on the World!"

Visitors, Attendance, Results, Referees, Venues

Visiting Teams

Since 1911, there have been 65 overseas teams visiting British Columbia to play local All-Star teams, representing 46 different clubs or associations. All but six of these visits have been by professional players.

Up to World War Two, the majority of visits were teams representing British FAs, with players selected from different pro clubs. Since 1949 the majority of visitors have been overseas pro clubs, spreading the word about their club and generating off-season income for the club and their players.

The most frequent visitors have been Scottish FA representative teams, with five visits in 1921, 1927, 1935, 1939 and 1967. The Scots won all 14 games they played against BC's All-Stars. The most frequent club visitors have been Glasgow Rangers, with four visits, in 1930, 1954, 1975 and 2014. The 'Gers' won all their seven games, scoring 40 goals against the All-Stars and only conceding three.

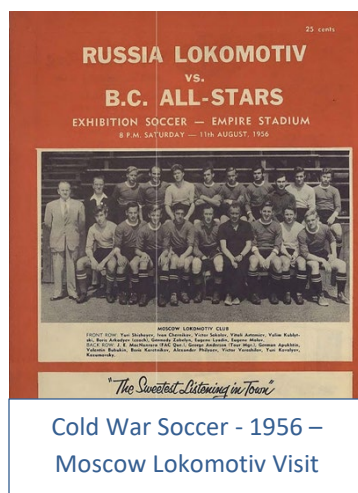

All-Star Attendance Records

BC's first All-Star game in 1911 drew 4,000 spectators to Recreation Park (at Smithe and Homer) in Vancouver to watch Corinthians. As Greater Vancouver's population has grown 16-fold since 1911, that is equivalent to a crowd of 65,000 today.

All record attendances have been in Vancouver. In the late 1920s and 1930, gate counts of 7,500 were recorded three times at Athletic Park (at 5th Ave. and Hemlock).

The record crowd before Empire Stadium opened was 9,594 at Callister Park to watch Tottenham in 1952.



With the opening of Empire Stadium in 1954, attendances more than doubled. The largest ever All-Star game gate was 20,050 to watch Moscow Lokomotiv in 1956, in the first All-Star game in Empire Stadium.

Overall Results

BC teams found the going hard in the early days of the All-Star teams. In matches with visiting professionals, the touring teams won the first 32 games from 1911 to 1949. In 1950, the BC All-Stars drew with the English FA, and in 1951 the Victoria All-Stars beat Fulham to record the first BC victory.

The four years from 1957 to 1960 were banner years for the BC All-Stars, the locals winning five of the nine games played, with wins over Tottenham, Admira Wien, West Bromwich, Municipal of Lima and Leningrad Zenit.

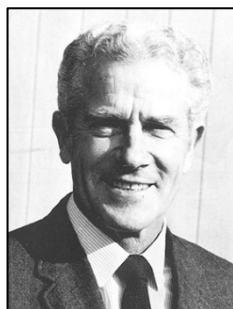
In total, there have been 109 games between visiting professionals and BC's men's All-Star teams. BC teams have won 14, drawn seven and lost 88 of these games.

Referees

While the record of referee assignments in All-Star games is incomplete, among games for which records are known, one referee, Dan Kulai, had a near monopoly on centre referee spots in the 1950s and 60s, taking charge of at least 21 All-Star games.



The next most assigned centre referee was Frank Lee with four games in that same time period. On the Mainland, Alex Murray (1930s) and Reg Clark (1970s) handled three games each, while in Victoria, Dave McMillan (1920/30s), Tom Robb (1930s) and George Barnes (1950s) were the "whistle-tooters" in three All-Star games each.

Venues

The 125 All-Star games have been played at 16 different locations, but two-thirds of games have been held at three stadiums.

In a 94-year span from 1911 to 2004, Victoria's Royal Athletic Park has hosted 34 All-Star games. From 1921 to 1959, Con Jones/Callister Park in Vancouver hosted 28 games, after which most games moved to Empire Stadium, which hosted 24 games. The primary venue in the mid-Island was Nanaimo's Central Sports Ground.

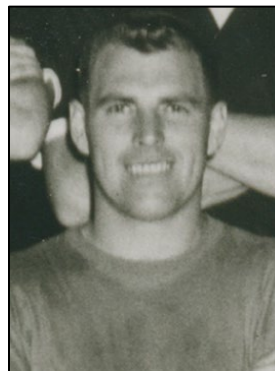

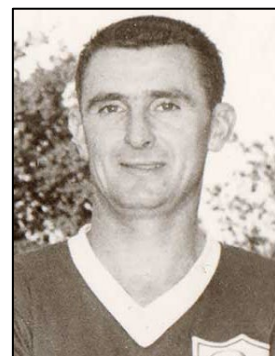
Doug Greig (21) – In the 1950s and 1960s, firefighter Doug Greig won the Coast League championship six times with St. Andrews, Firefighters, Westminster Royals and Vancouver City. Usually a half-back, Greig was a: "supreme ball control artist... in a class all his own".



Ken Pears (20) – Unquestionably the leading goalkeeper of his generation. Between 1951 and 1970, Ken Pears won 4 national club championships, 7 BC Province Cups, 7 PCL championships and back-stopped the 1957 BC All-Stars who beat Tottenham.



Art Hughes (18) – Also in the 1950s and 1960s, Hughes was the pre-eminent goal-scoring centre-forward, a traditional 'big target man', described as the "the most exciting player to colour our game in many years".



Gogie Stewart (16) – A Coast League stand-out for 17 seasons from 1947 to 1965, the fiery Stewart usually played inside left, notably for Westminster Royals, and also won two lacrosse Mann Cups.

Dave Stothard (16) – Playing for Westminster Royals and Victoria United/O'Keefe, Stothard was noted as a right-back, "one of Canada's finest fullbacks", but could play anywhere on the field, leading Victoria in scoring one season.

Brian Philley (14) – The middle of the three Philley brothers, inside or centre forward Brian Philley was described as "one of the league's top playmakers" and one of the most skilled players of his era.

Normie McLeod (13) – Coming to the fore as the 1954 Sun Tournament "Soccer Boy", prolific goal-scorer Normie grew up in the noted McLeod soccer family. He scored Canada's first ever goal in World Cup qualifying in 1957.

Roy Buster Cairns (12) - From the Fraser Valley, usually playing at left-back, Cairns made up for his 5' 6" height by being "a rare player and tenacious tackler". In the 1950s, Cairns won five Canadian club championships, mostly with Westminster Royals.

Fred Whittaker (12) – From 1941 to 1954, centre-forward Fred Whittaker won the Coast League scoring title six times and was the league's all-time top scorer with 156 goals.

Other Notable All-Stars – Other notable All-Stars in the last 110 years include:

Murray West (9) - The honour for most appearances before World War Two goes to Murray West, selected nine times from 1929 to 1939. A stand-out player of the 1930s, West was captain, half-back and "kingpin" of St. Saviours.

Dickie Stobbart (8) - Earlier still, Stobbart appeared eight times from 1921 to 1931. Stobbart was "considered to be one of the finest halfbacks or inside forwards in Canadian soccer history", playing with Nanaimo, Ladysmith and Westminster Royals.

Jackie Charlton - Several visiting overseas players made guest appearances for BC All-Stars, including Rudi Krol, Lou Macari and Peter Beardsley. In town for coaching appearances, Jackie Charlton, 1966 World Cup winner with England, suited up for BC teams twice in 1971 and 1972.

1951 Victoria All-Stars vs Fulham

The Victoria All-Stars of June 1951 made history when they became the first BC team to defeat a touring professional team, beating Fulham of England's top-level First Division by 1-0.

By 1951, the touring pros had not lost a single game to BC's best in 38 straight games. Then London's Fulham FC of the English First Division came to Canada. They defeated BC All-Stars in Vancouver by 2-0, then went to Royal Athletic Park to take on the Victoria All-Stars on June 7th.

On June 8th, the English papers had to report that... "Fulham had been beaten, beaten in Canada, beaten in Victoria, beaten by 1 to 0". Not only was this the first touring pro team defeat in BC, it was the first time one of these teams had been held scoreless. After absorbing pressure in the first 30 minutes, at 33 minutes, a Victoria corner by Bob Allen evaded the Fulham keeper and Victoria left-wing Ab Travis "hit a first-timer into the twine".

For the rest of the game, the home-town defence, with Joe Travis, the scorer's elder brother in goal, suffered unrelenting Fulham attacks, but successfully held out. The Times-Colonist summarized: "It would be impossible here to describe the final torrid 30 minutes. One had to see it to appreciate it. Time and time again Travis either made the save or had his fullbacks in position to clear the ball. Four times the ball was on the goal line. Four times Travis cleared".

The victorious and history-making Victoria team had eight players from the Coast League's Victoria United with three additions, all First Nations players. Full-back Herman Henry and half-back Ken Williams played for Duncan Native Sons of Cowichan and forward Stan Bob came from Nanaimo's Brechin Athletic. Herman Henry was chosen to captain the All-Stars for the game.

1957 BC All-Stars vs Tottenham Hotspur

In 1957, BC All-Stars defeated the touring Tottenham Hotspur, the second-best English League team at the time.

It is June 1957. Tottenham Hotspur is in town. In 1952, the 'Spurs had put 24 goals past three BC teams. In 1957 they had just finished second in the English First Division. In three prior games across Canada, they had scored 21 goals, conceding only two. They defeated Glasgow Celtic by 6-3 in Vancouver. Celtic players said that: "They're dynamite... they are the fastest team we've met". Newspapers reported: "Experts agree these Tottenham tourists are the finest footballers ever to invade Canada" On June 3rd 1957, 9,000 came to watch, despite expectations the BC All-Stars would get a drubbing from this cream of English soccer.

But... next morning, the headlines ran: "BC All-Stars Humble Mighty Hotspurs" and said "You wouldn't be far out if you if you called it the upset of the century". The pride of BC had beaten Tottenham two goals to nil. BC's half-backs had neutralized Tottenham's flowing game and BC's legendary keeper Ken Pears made critical saves. In the 71st minute veteran Brian Philley scored on a long pass from 18-year-old Normie McLeod. Four minutes later McLeod sealed the victory with a goal from 20 yards out. Tottenham's manager Jimmy Anderson was magnanimous: "They are a grand team. Our boys weren't off their form – they played their best and were beaten".

This was indeed a "grand" BC team and home-grown. All eleven starters were born in Western Canada; nine were born in BC. Ten of the starting eleven are members of the Canadian and BC Soccer Halls of Fame in their own right, as is manager Don Petrie. To cap things, three weeks later the same eleven starting players were selected to represent Canada in its first ever World Cup qualifying game, a 5-1 victory over the USA in Toronto.

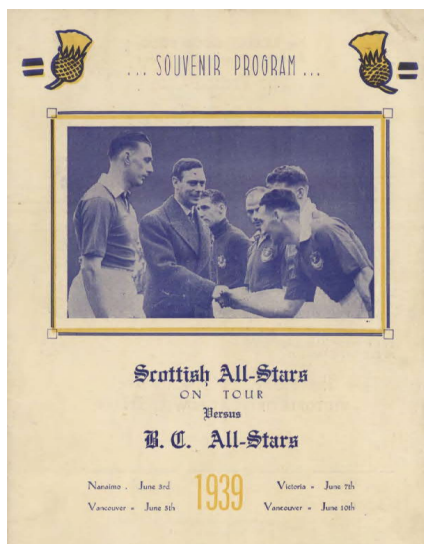
Our All-Stars Program Collection
